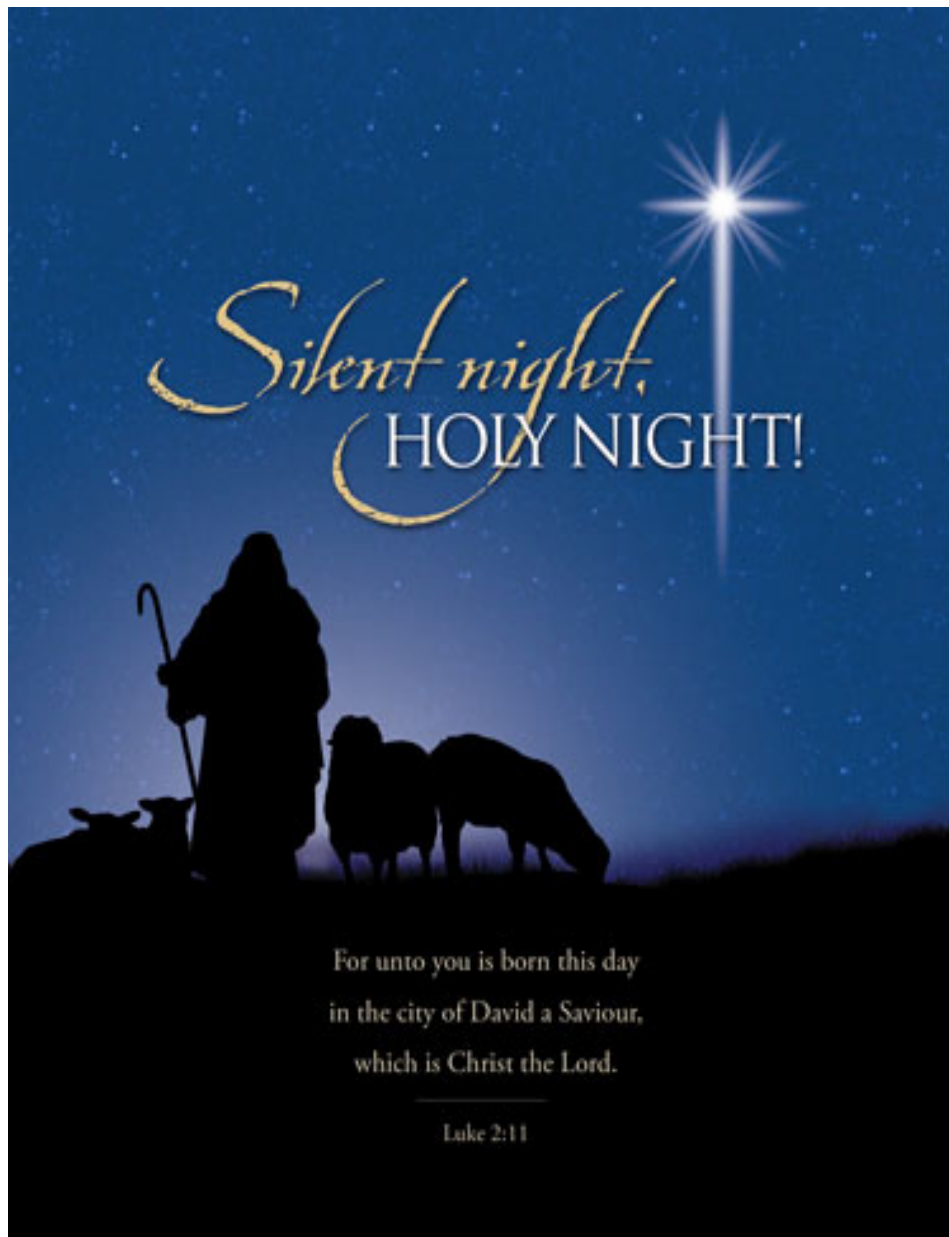

Fourth Sunday of Advent And The Nativity of the Lord

Gifts of Appreciated Securities in 2017 Can Benefit You and St. Perpetua

With the year racing to a close, time is running short for anyone planning to make a year-end charitable contribution to the St. Perpetua Capital Campaign. With the stock market at record highs, investors with appreciated securities have enhanced giving opportunities. The full value of an appreciated security may be deductible for income tax purposes if given to St. Perpetua this year AND without reduction by any capital gains tax. This can truly leverage your gift and minimize your taxes. And remember - consult your own tax advisor on what makes the most financial sense for you.

Over 70½ and want to minimize taxes by having your 2017 IRA Minimum Distribution paid directly to St. Perpetua?

Are you older than 70½ ? Do you need to take a 2017 Required Minimum Distribution from your IRA before year end? Tired of paying a big chunk of that in taxes? Consider having some or all of it paid directly from your IRA to St. Perpetua before year end and the amount will be counted toward satisfying your 2017 Required Minimum Distribution AND will not be taxed to you. Consult with your own tax advisors to make sure this make sense for you, and contact the Parish Office or visit www.stperpetua.org for more information on how to make these year-end distributions. (Note: different rules will apply for SEP IRAs and Simple IRAs)
